BLC COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS (Meeting conducted via Zoom) August 11, 2020

Education Committee

Lisa Jones introduced as new director of Education Committee

Treasurer's Report (Anne Taylor)

- Lola Vulles gave \$100,000 gift in June. Requested that 10% go to community gifting, 90% to be used for future use.
- June Income \$27,976; expenditures \$39,196.
- July income \$26,813; expenditures \$32,140. Ending balance July 31st \$27,084.
- Discussion regarding how bills are paid.

Music Ministry Report (Marshall Jones)

- Used new portable sound system for two outdoor hymn sings in July & August with about 10 people gathering for each to sing favorite hymns together.
- Have enough willing to ring in small ensembles to have one handbell quartet; enough ringers also for two teams willing to ring descants for hymns.
- Enough people willing to sing in separate SATB quartets.
- Been posting hymns for the week on Facebook. Some said they have learned a lot from the posts.

Pastor's Report (Pastor Scott Thompson)

 Been a busy summer: High School retreat, "yea, Tony"; spent time with Jr. High kids at BLC camp; church painted; Serious JuJu Friday night skate has taken off. Reminded Council of Church in the Park, Aug. 16th.

Education Report (Vicky Nytes, Outgoing Director)

- Committee wondering what does church look like this fall? Sunday School teachers lined up with Rally Day tentatively scheduled for Sept. 20th. Pastor Scott reported that 'God's Work, Our Hands' service day would not be happening on the 13th so could move SS up a week if wish to.
- Suggested that Ed Committee make a plan and present to families/congregation for input.
- Pastor also reported there is 0% chance of having 2 services on the same morning so timing of SS will be crucial.

Youth Report (Tony Nelson)

- Youth retreat was a success. 13 of 14 kids attended. Tony felt they were desperate to be together so it was a great community building time. Youth Committee is also discussing what to do this fall. Kids said NO to Zoom.
- Committee leaning towards giving school a month or so and see what happens with cases. Anne Taylor felt we need to stop being so fearful and trust in God to take care of us. Tony agreed but was looking at it as 'managing risk'. Amber Brohn suggested parents be involved in this conversation.

Old Business

- Duane Anderson reported that the PPE loan was for \$32,992.50. Looks like the loan could be converted to a grant as May/June expenditures for payroll, health, and retirement was in excess of \$44,067.
- John Erfle still looking for budget requests from Youth, Fellowship, and Education. All three committees stated that their requests were the same as in 2019.
- Bill Pursell reported that painting on church buildings was completed. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to use the \$5,000 in Restricted Funds for Painting of Church and pay the balance out of Real Estate Fund.
- Pastor reported that Serious JuJu's presence on the church campus has been a blessing to both the JuJu skaters and the congregation. About 8-10 kids plus adults are taking part every Friday.
- A motion was made by Stewardship Committee, seconded and approved by Council to have Chuck McCoy and Jason Cronk make a proposal and presentation to Council in September for low-income housing/community service/commercial development on the south end of the church-owned property. Council would then consider authorizing a more detailed presentation to the congregation leading up to a vote on the proposal by the congregation at a special Congregational meeting in November.

New Business

- A motion was made, seconded and approved to appoint Lisa Jones as replacement Director of the Education Committee.
- Bill Pursell reported that there are numerous cracks and broken chunks of brick on the bell tower and other places. An insurance claim has been started and an engineer is looking at it. Not sure what cost of repairs will be. It does need to be done by winter.
- Duane Anderson reported that several trees (Mountain Ash) are dying on 7th St. East, south of the apartments and a couple of Elms are overgrown. Those trees on the boulevard are city property and they have been tagged for 2021 maintenance. Property committee will also deal with the dying Mountain Ash by the Hjortland Bldg.
- Paul Holmgren reported that he's tried contacting the Knowledge Nest PreSchool about their plans for the school year but he's not heard back from them. It is thought that they may be waiting on the Kalispell School Districts scheduling.

- Pastor Scott presented a proposal for Worship Fall 2020. After much discussion a motion was made, seconded and approved to hold one worship service per week at 9 am on Sunday and continue Online/Radio service. Mask wearing would be mandatory for people who do not have a medical exemption.
- There is a need to upgrade equipment for video streaming on Facebook. It could cost about \$4,000 for camera, software, sound mic connections, computer, and additional wiring. A motion was made, seconded and approved to authorize Pastor Scott to look into upgrading Audio Visual equipment, up to \$5,000, for good, quality equipment.
- Duane Anderson reported that Co-Rental has no BLC tenants that are having trouble paying rent. If that situation should come up, BLC will act with forgiveness.

Next meeting is Tuesday, September 8, 2020.


